#### 1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

• Every semester the academic calendar is framed by the Institution on line with academic schedule of Anna University, Chennai. • Course allocation is finalized by Head of the Department on the basis of faculty's technical skill, competency level, experience, students' feedback and academic performance. • At the beginning of every Semester, Course Committee Meeting is organized within the department (common to all sections) and with other department for common courses. • The Course Outcomes, assignments, Case Studies and Self Study Topics are planned. • Based on the expected Course Outcomes, content beyond syllabus are identified and delivery plan are formulated accordingly. • Induction program is planned to educate the new entrants about the environment and culture of the institution, expose them to a sense of self exploration before the regular classes start. • Bridge course is planned to meet out the prerequisite for the core courses. • Every semester students are encouraged to register at least one course related to the courses in that semester through IIT Spoken Tutorial. • All the Course handlers plan their lecture schedule based on the academic calendar, syllabus and department time table. • The course in-charge communicates the course objectives and expected outcomes to the students at the start of the course. • Course delivery is carried out as per the planning mentioned in the lecture schedule and it is recorded correspondingly in the Assessment Record. • Course handlers have freedom of delivering their lecture by using various teaching aids like black board, OHP, LCD, video, NPTEL. • The Academic performance of the Students are measured and monitored through Centralized Internal Tests and Class Tests. • Students are also assessed by course handler using various tools that determine the ability of students such as Assignments, Quiz, Group Discussion and Presentations. • Students are identified as quick and slow learners based on their performance in their tests. • Quick learners are motivated to secure higher grades as well as University ranks and slow learners are counseled to undergo tutorial / coaching classes to perform better. Class Committee Meetings are scheduled and conducted effectively by each department to encourage the students to improve their academic performance and other skills. Class Committee Meetings are held three times in a semester to monitor the progress of the course and the assessment tools used by the teacher for effective teaching learning and evaluation process. The reports of the class committee meetings are reviewed by the Head of the Department and suggestions are given to the course in-charge for improvement. Department Faculty Meetings are conducted to review the progress of the course delivery and any improvement in the teaching learning process, if required, is suggested for implementation. Course Outcome survey is obtained from all the students for all the courses at the end of the semester. Course Outcomes and Program Outcomes attainment are analyzed. Students'

feedback is obtained at the end of the semester and faculty members are motivated to improve the course delivery method in the subsequent semester.

#### Feedback Obtained

The feedback is obtained from the students, faculty members, employers, alumni and parents. The analysis and utilization process is carried out as given below. • Students Communication sent to staff and students about the procedure for getting online student feedback on faculty, Lab Incharge, Lab Assistant and College facilities a week before the process. HODs / Senior staff addresses the students regarding the significance of such feedback system. Online student feedback about faculty, Lab Incharge, Lab Assistant and College facilities are obtained once in a semester, as per the schedule given in the academic calendar. Information Systems Support Group (ISSG) facilitates the student's feedback collection process through online after collecting the necessary information from all the departments. Feedback is obtained from students, and their attendances are recorded. Students will fill the mark ranging from 10 (Excellent) to 2 (Poor) and will submit for final consolidation. Students feedback about individual faculty member is analyzed by Quality Circle Successful Graduation Convenor and performance review meeting is conducted for the faculty who have secured less than class average. A Performance review is conducted by a team allotted by the principal along with Head of the Department to motivate the faculty members towards scoring higher student appraisal. Head of the Department along with overall lab incharge analyzed the feedback about lab incharge and lab assistants and motivate them to satisfy the students requirements towards acquiring technical skills. Feedback on college facilities are obtained from the students are analyzed and the summary is sent to the Management Representative / ISO for further action. The least attained criteria, from all the departments are discussed during the Management Representative Meeting of ISO for further improvement. • Faculty Members Feedback on college facilities are obtained from the faculty members are analyzed and the summary is sent to the Management Representative / ISO for further action. Attendance shortage, if any, poor performance in the internal tests / Anna University examinations etc. will be commented by the student counselor in the appropriate places of the student counselor diary. It will be reviewed by HOD once in a semester to check the consistency of entry of various details. Maintenance and utilization of the Infrastructure Facilities: The maintenance and upkeep of the infrastructure facilities are carried out with the support of the heads of the particular infrastructure department. The following is the organizational chart of the departments. Civil Maintenance: The civil maintenance is headed by the Teaching Faculty. He is in charge of four divisions, water and sewage, building, carpentry and Gardening. Each division is headed by a supervisor and is employed by respective skill workers. Computers, Software's UPS: The computers are maintained in the Institution by "Information System Support Group (ISSG)". This division provides the integrated IT services like smooth running of automation, upgradation and maintenance of automation package, college website, biometric services, troubleshooting of hardware, networking equipment including internet connectivity, procurement of hardware, software. Vehicles: Transport There are forty three buses, two staff

van, 4 cars one Ambulance. The buses are plying covering all the routes for the use of staff and students. The two vans are exclusively utilized for HODs, Senior Professors and Guest speakers. The Emergency Van (Ambulance) is available in the college 247 hours for students and faculty at the time of emergency. Electrical Maintenance: The electrical maintenance section is headed by the HOD/EEE. A senior professor in the electrical department is supported by an electrical maintenance (Manager) of the campus with the support of Electrical Engineer, Supervisor and Electricians. Library: The library is headed by librarian and he is the premises superior for both U.G. and P.G. library. He is supported by the assistant librarian, supporting staff (Senior and junior clerks) for Journal and Reference sections. In addition to the above staff, junior safety Assistants, and attenders will help the students for searching and lending of the books in the library. Physical Education: The physical education department is facilitated by the physical directors to educate the students. The marker of the department makes the play field ready for the students, by marking the ground and providing the play kits. Health Centre: The health center of the college is governed by the Medical officer. The Doctor is supported by a pharmacist and a nurse. The nurse is assisted by nursing assistants. The health center has three beds and has enough space to cater the needs of the patients and it is utilized by students, staff of K.L.N.C.E. and by the village dwellers around college campus. Security: The Security of the college is headed by the senior Teaching staff. He is supported by the Security officer and the sergeant. Security officer assigns the duty to the security guards to control and monitor the college the premises. The sergeant takes care of the cleanlinessinside the college with the support of Housekeepers and sanitary workers. Laboratory Equipment: The equipment and machines in the laboratory/workshop are maintained by the lab Incharge(s)/workshop InCharge(s) with the advice of HOD through ISSG.

Technical committee focuses on overall growth of the students with an emphasis on academic related issues, formulated with the coordination of the departments and the institute to encourage the students to interact and share their knowledge with the outer world through their active participation in workshop/Paper contest/Conferences/Project contest etc. The committee brings together industrial and subject experts to hold training which facilitates in bridging the gap between the institute and industry. This in turn gives the students an exposure on industrial requirements and technical trends beyond the classroom learning. Value added courses are carried out by several cells convened within the department such as SAE INDIA KLNCE Collegiate Club and SPC (Automobile), The Indian Society of Heating Refrigerating and Air Conditioning (Mechanical), Association of Computer Engineers and CSI (Computer Science and Engineering), EINSTEA association (Electronics and Instrumentation Engineering), Elite association (Electrical and Electronics Engineering), Microelectronics Club and Social Club (ECE), ODYSSEY (Mathematics Department), KLNCE Science and Humanities Association (Science and Humanities Departments), Emerging Information Technologist Association (MCA) and GEMS Association and CII Chapter and Young Indian Madurai Chapter (MBA). These associations aim in conducting activities to further supplement their theoretical knowledge and also develop the students' personality as well as strengthen their learning capabilities. Guidance is given to the students on various aspects of building a career and to assist them in exploring new opportunities. The cultural and literary association conducts cultural activities which provide an opportunity for socialization and self assessment among the students in exhibiting their hidden talents. Extracurricular programme such as NSS, YRC and Rotaract clubs helps the students to identify the problems of the community, gain skills in mobilizing as a team and to utilize their knowledge to find solution. Other welfare committees such as Hostel and class committees effectively function in addressing the grievances and suggestions of the students through their representatives periodically.

Each department prepares the budget according to request from lab incharges and faculty members and forwarded to the Principal for sanction. Principal forwards the overall budget for the college to the management for approval. The budget is reviewed by the management and approved. The institute also makes a provision for advance/ additional funds. The Principal and the Heads discuss the requirements and decide in allotting financial resources for various purposes ensuring optimum use of available financial resources. The Governing Body studies the annual expenditure, scrutinizes the budget and provides feedback for efficient use of financial resources. Department heads ensure that suitable equipment with the right specifications are procured at competitive, optimal prices. Budget utilization is periodically reviewed by the management. 2. Academic functioning: The collegeprovides authority at various levels. Each department is given academic freedom by empowering the head of the department and faculty members. Each department is empowered to prepare itsown Time Table, to organize workshops, expert talks and Faculty Development Programs, to plan for inplant training and industrial visits to students etc. Quality Circles: OurCollege has constituted four quality circles namely Quality Circle for Quality Education, Quality circle for successful graduation, Quality Circle for Potential Employability and Quality Circle for Advanced Research and Development. Each quality circle has a convener and faculty members from each department. They used to convene a meeting once in a year to plan the activities for the whole year. Best project competition is organized every year by IPC (Innovative Promotion Cell) and best projects were awarded with cash prizes.

PG library is responsible for MBA and MCA departments. College has paid the renewal fees for IEEE online journals. Students and staff can access the online journals from the central library. Each department has its own library with text books, research publications and presentation of their staff members and students. ICT The ICT facilities in the class rooms have been increased. The internet connectivity has also been maintained at 155 Mbps. In order to improve overall utilization of net access to all staff members and students, it has been decided to improve the internet speed. Online test was also conducted for various campus interview processes. Infrastructure / Instrumentation In order to meet the requirements of new regulations, it has been decided to procure systems and other accessories as per the requirement.

Human Resource Management

The strength of teaching faculty is 206 and non teaching is 132. Fifty percent of teaching staff have completed 10 years of service in our college. An average of 10 years of experience among faculties in various departments is a good sign of overall satisfaction. The registration fee is given to staff members to attend workshops, short term courses, faculty Development Programs organized by other colleges. Cash incentive is given to staff members who have published their papers in reputed journals and presented their papers in International Conferences. Seed money is given to staff members for executing their research projects and making them a product. Staff members both teaching and non teaching are provided with medical insurance and provident fund as a sign of welfare practice. Welfare measures implemented by management make the employees to work safely.

Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Our college has Industry Institute Partnership Cell (IIPC) to bridge the gap between Industry and Institute. This cell has a Coordinator and faculty members from each department. This cell plans activities for an academic year and executed it with the help of all stake holders. Each department organizes an expert talk, workshops and faculty development programs with the help of this cell by inviting industrial experts for the benefit of staff members and students. College has a MoU with Infosys and through this MoU, students of various departments got Campus Connect certification from Infosys. College has got MoU with Honeywell which enables the computer science students to get internships in Honeywell. MoU with BSNL helps the students to undergo inplant training in BSNL. Placement Cell of our college organizes oncampus drives with leading industries and 40 of the students got their placement opportunities. Centre for University Industry collaboration (CUIC) of Anna University has also organized campus drives for leading companies like Infosys, Accenture in our college by selecting our college as nodal centre for various college students.

Admission of Students

Admission team headed by Principal is responsible for admission of students.

	This team comprise of faculty members from various departments. They have implemented various admission strategies to improve the number of students admitted in each department. Advertisements were given in leading news papers. Admission of the students is through Single Window counseling system conducted by Anna University, Chennai. Management has admitted students in management quota if they satisfy the minimum requirements. In PG also, 30 of the students were admitted through counseling and remaining 70 were admitted through management. PG departments have their own admission strategies to admit students in their respective departments.
Curriculum Development	Our institution is affiliated to Anna University Chennai. We strictly follow the curriculum prescribed by the Anna University. For each course, staff members are requested to handle one or two content beyond syllabus topics by mentioning them in the lecture schedule.
Teaching and Learning	Academic Calendar is prepared at the beginning of a semester. Department library incharges are requested to prepare the required book list and it has to be submitted to librarian before the commencement of the classes. Librarian has to ensure that adequate books are available for each course for each year. Staff members are informed to prepare notes for their subject and submit it to Academic Audit Committee for verification. Each staff member is requested to prepare a Lesson plan for their course and they have to include content beyond syllabus topics in the Lecture schedule. Soft copy of the class notes, Part A questions with answers and Part B questions are prepared by the staff members and forwarded to mail id of students. Each staff member has to maintain an assessment record which includes attendance details of students, syllabus covered as per the lesson plan, marks scored by students in the internal tests etc. The details in the assessment record have to be verified and signed by Head of the Department at the end of every month. Expert talks, workshops were planned by Head of the Departments for required courses to

Student Admission and Support	College automation system has created a username and password for each student.  College website supports students to know their attendance and internal marks. SMS is sent to students regarding reopening date, placement classes, coaching classes, internal marks, parents Teachers Meeting intimation etc. Placement cell has created Whatsapp groups with individual department students. Information like On Campus drives, special coaching classes for each drive, placement tips for that drive are posted in these Whatsapp groups. The teaching faculty has also created Whatsapp groups to post important notes, solved question papers, list of important questions etc to students' community.
Examination	College conducts 5 internal tests per semester. Two exams were conducted as class tests, another two conducted as centralized internal tests and the last one as model exam. Answer scripts were evaluated and marks are fed into automation system within 3 days. For slow learners retest was conducted and marks are reentered. College also displayed the internal marks on college website for the benefit of students and parents. Online exams are conducted for some of the courses in Google forms by faculty members. Students are motivated to make use of ELearning tools such as Moodle (Modular Object Oriented Dynamic

Learning Environment) for specific courses. Staff members and students are motivated to do online NPTEL courses and to get certifications. This year 351 teaching staff and students got NPTEL certifications during October 2018 and April 2019 Examinations.

### 7.2 - Best Practices

As one of the best practices, K.L.N.C.E established Industry Collaborative laboratories namely Texas Innovation Laboratory, Honeywell Sentience Laboratory, ISHRAE Laboratory, National Instruments Laboratory and eYantra laboratory. Objective Practice: The main objective is to provide handson learning to engineering students who have limited access to practical training. The goal is to create the next generation of engineers with a practical outlook to take on challenging problems and provide solutions. It aims at training students in various domains like embedded system, robotics, ICP certification on clean rooms, ACDesign, AC Service and other ventilation related areas, Hackathon contest, Natural Language Processing, Data Work Flow, Chat Bot using Machine Language Image Processing, LabVIEW basics, NI hardwares and development of boards using MSP 430, ALSK Pro. Outcome of the practice: • to provide an Opportunity to the student to work on the current technology used in the industry • Students to showcase their innovations in terms of projects which can be engineered as product • Designing a solutions to the industry problems • Research activities in this domain • Develop IoT applications • Students will get the opportunity to learn, analyze, apply their theoretical knowledge, develop skills Evidence of Success: Through eYantra portal , students have come out with four innovative project proposals and two of them were shortlisted for finals. About 21 students belonging to various disciplines have won the Dhrish TI online contest and bagged cash awards worth Rs.50,000/ Financial support have been rendered to carry out innovative projects by students through ISHRAE society Hackathon contest carried out under HTS has resulted up in winning a cash reward of Rs.1,00,000/ The other best practice followed in K.L.N.C.E is inculcating research culture among staff and students through QCARD. Objective QCARD of KLNCE aims to create and develop innovative research among community of academicians which in turn to give frontline practice to student's community in the arena of research. KLNCE believes that acquiring research practices and bringing out new cutting edge technologies among academicians improves the student betterment towards research. QCARD as a best practice emphasizes and set goals for faculty members by enabling them to discover new ideas which ultimately brand them as a knowledge contributor. Context KLNCE is situated in a remote area from town and thus it is indeed necessary to provide research infrastructure for both faculty members and students within the college environment. It is need of the day to compete with competitive research world and thus QCARD motivates faculty members to develop innovative projects with the help of seed funding sponsored by management of KLNCE. Proactive faculty members of the institution get involved and acquire knowledge on research from quality research programs organized by QCARD. QCARD act as a stepping stone for young researchers to face outside world with stateoftheart knowledge The practice: The convener of QCARD convenes frequent meetings among members to convey research oriented activities such as project proposals, quality publications and workshops. QCARD as a research forum motivates domain experts within the college to deliver their area of focus among faculty members which may be an initiative for multidisciplinary projects. To make faculty members to get familiar with research funding, Project scrutiny meeting will be conducted to provide seed fund from management. The practice of submitting proposals in a prescribed format and completion report is cultivated among faculty members.

Conducting Seminars/Workshops/Faculty Development Programs in advanced research topics. 4. Providing incentives to faculty members who published papers in reputed journals. 6. Motivating faculty members to act as reviewers in reputed journals. Evidence of Success: This forum has conspicuous outcome in developing research culture in education environment. Research proposal writing and its number have been increased among faculty members from inception. Seed funding helps faculty members to come out with innovative ideas and place as stepping stone to develop prototype. The developed prototype is shown as proof of concept for submitting project proposals to external funding agencies. Faculty members use the proof of concept for filing patents. Many of the faculty members improved their quality publications in various international journals. Research supervisors of KLNCE Research Centre motivate their research scholars for quality publication in reputed journals. Among various project proposals submitted, 10 innovative ideas were scrutinized by a panel of members and an amount of Rs.9.5 Lakhs has been sanctioned as SEED fund to develop the models by the Management. Two projects namely Electrostatic conductive Dissipative Coatings and Motorized Vertically Adjustable Black Board were filed for patent and they are under scrutiny.
